



Search and Rescue in Canada

When: Thursday, 19 May, 2005

Where: The Ottawa-Hull Naval Association Mess, Middle St., Victoria Island.

Time: 1900 hours

Our guest speaker will be Mr. Derek Smith and assisted by Ms France Bergeron, with the National Search and Rescue Secretariat, (NSS) here in Ottawa.

Derek and France will talk to us about Search & Rescue (SAR) in Canada, concentrating on marine and inland SAR.

Derek has extensive knowledge of SAR operations in the UK and more recently here in Canada. He was 12 years with Her Majesty's Coast Guard in the UK and was responsible for the SAR service on the south coast of England. For the past 18 months he has been a liaison officer with the National SAR Secretariat in Ottawa.

France is a senior analyst at NSS. She has past experience with Health Canada and Public Safety, and is retired from the Canadian Forces.

The OPP, Ottawa, Gatineau Police and Parks Canada have been invited to attend and answer questions related to regulation on the Ottawa and the Rideau systems.

This should prove to be a very informative evening on a topic that affects all who boat in this area.

Unlocking your car with your keys locked in

Just in case you lock the keys in the car, give this a try and you should be able to get in unlocking your car with your keys locked in (assuming that you have a car that can be unlocked by that remote button on your key ring).

If you lock your keys in the car and the spare keys are home, and you don't have "OnStar", here's your answer to the problem!

If some one has access to the spare remote at your home, call them on your cell phone (or borrow one from someone if the cell phone is locked in the car too!).

Hold your (or anyone's) cell phone about a foot from your car door and have the other person at your home press the unlock button, holding it near the phone on their end.

Your car will unlock!

Distance is no object. You could be hundreds of miles away, and if you can reach someone who has the other "remote" for your car, you can unlock the doors (or the trunk, or have the "horn" signal go off, or whatever!). Saves someone from having to drive your keys to you.
