Headquarters has now received a supply of Distress Signaling DVD's and they are in stock - both as part of a package within the Distress Signaling Manual and as a stand alone product in professional looking black DVD cases. The DVD is in both English and French, each on its own track.

The product is being made available to both members and the public with Squadron and Member pricing outlined in our price list in members moorings. Suggested non-member retail price is \$19.95 for the stand alone DVD and \$36.95 for the combined Seminar/DVD package.
