or the boater that is tech savvy there is a couple of new publications and seminars that are available, you can check the National Website but this is just a teaser to do so.

So what is new?

Radar for Pleasure Craft

This 130 page manual also comes with a CD for use on your PC which includes a radar simulator with MARPA (for collision avoidance) capability. While many of our boaters do not have radar and do not boat in main shipping areas it is a useful tool, for those who attended the Squadron's Annual Dinner, Jim McLeod's testimony regarding navigating in Fog in the Saguenay Region may tweak your interest in this publication.

Electronic Charting

This is another superb publication and describes itself as a course that takes over where Navigation with GPS leaves off. You learn of the different kinds of electronic charting and their advantages and disadvantages, and of connecting to your GPS and other peripherals.

The publication also comes with a CD which includes over 200 electronic charts and a programme enabling you to display and use them.

Both publications with CD's are a great addition to CPS publications and seminars.

You may wonder how some of this all comes about, I suspect that much of the work on both CD's is largely due to Morton Biback a CPS member who has done monumental work with such material as the GPS and Maritime Radio simulators.



BOOK REVIEW

WARSHIPS OF THE GREAT LAKES 1754-1834 By Robert Malcomson ISBN 1 84067 535 7

This book which was first published in the United Kingdom in 2001 was researched and written by Robert Malcolmson now a retired Elementary School Teacher from St. Catharines, Ontario and a Naval Historian with several books on that time period to his credit.

The book as the title suggests covers a period of eighty years from 1754 until 1834 and describes the shipbuilding and various engagements of the British, American and French naval forces in their struggle to gain control of the Great Lakes and the strategic route through Lake Champlain to New York.

Robert has thoroughly researched his material bringing to light many facts and figures of the naval endeavours in what was then the North American wilderness. Most naval vessels on the Lakes in that time period are described in some detail, including type, length, width, tonnage, guns, where built, when launched, etc.

What is astonishing is the time, effort, skills and sheer ingenuity to build these vessels, one of the interesting facts that I had never read about was that a number of warships were prefabricated at Chatham Dockyard in England, the parts shipped across the Atlantic and reassembled on Lake Ontario and Lake Erie, all this and 700 workers and naval crews to man them.

Among the many vessels mentioned is the huge warship launched at Kingston on 10th. September 1814, this was a vessel of approximately 2400 tons and carried some 104 guns, this would have been right at home with Nelson's fleet, for the enthusiast there is a superb model of the St. Lawrence in the Canadian War Museum, Ottawa.

For those who interested in Canadian History and especially the naval vessels of that bygone era, I would certainly recommend this superb publication.

The price in the UK was 28 pounds.


