Steve Highstead manned a booth at the Manotick Classic Boat Club boat show. If I may be so bold as to take several excerpts from Steve's report,



Bio:

Athan Baron is a sailor from the Great Lakes that grew up in Kingston Ontario. Nathan's sailing career started at the age of 10 and since then he has sailed and raced over 10,000nm on the Great Lakes. Nathan began racing "big boats" in Kingston harbour and successfully campaigned on the Lake Ontario Offshore circuit for several years before jumping ship to J/24s, Sharks and other one design classes. Among his many accomplishments, Nathan was the 2006 Shark Canadian Champion, fourth in the Freeman Cup, and has placed in the top ten at the last two Shark World championships.

In February of this year Nathan announced that he intends to compete in the 2009 Mini Transat, a single handed race across the Atlantic, which is sailed in very small and overpowered offshore dinghies called the

Open 6.5 or "mini". Since then, Nathan and his Minimus Sailing Team have raised the funds to buy a boat for the race and have begun training out of the Kingston Yacht Club.

In order to achieve this goal Nathan created the Minimus Sailing Team. The team support Nathan in fund raising, training, and boat and sail development, as well as travel and logistical support. The team is composed of ex-Olympic sailors, industry professionals as well as marketing and public relations professionals that have all donated their time to support this amazing challenge.

On September 13th, 2007 at 1900h, Nathan will be making a presentation to the Canadian Power and Sail Squadron, Ottawa Chapter, on the race, what it takes to run a high profile sailing campaign, and his plans for the time leading up to the Mini Transat.

Nathan's multimedia presentation will feature video of the boats sailing, an explanation of the race track as well as the process to qualify. He will also discuss special equipment, sleep management and heavy weather (and light weather) tactics for single handed sailors.

Please join us to help support Nathan in this challenge and to hear more about this intriguing class of extreme offshore yachts.






