The first 100 Ottawa Power & Sail Squadron members and current boating course students who attend the 2007 AGM and purchase a full meal package will receive a **refund of \$20** as a thank you from your Squadron Bridge for attending. There is nothing to do on your part to be eligible; we will get a list of Ottawa attendees from the 2007 AGM committee and we expect to have the refund cheques out by November, 2007 (of course this refund program is not available to members who are having another organisation pay their way).

# 2007 CPS Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Ottawa

The AGM portion of the conference will start at 0800 hours on Saturday, October 27th and currently there are two issues which the Squadron Commanders will vote on. One will be regarding a modest increase in the annual dues, and the other will be with respect to the Brand Name for the organisation.

Details on both these items can be found in an insert to the Fall 2007 issue of The Port Hole, on page 2 and are marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" respectively.

#### Schedule "A", Annual Dues Increase

After reading the information in The Port Hole, your Bridge gave me clear direction at the October 2nd, 2007 Bridge meeting to support the motion as put forth and consequently unless I hear differently from you, the CPS membership in the Ottawa Power & Sail Squadron, I will vote for (YES) this item at the AGM.

#### Schedule "B", Brand Name Selection

After reading the information in The Port Hole, your Bridge gave me clear direction at the October 2nd, 2007 Bridge meeting that none of the three finalists are worthy of being our new Brand Name. Since the selection "none of the above" is a valid choice for this vote, the issue becomes more complex in that there doesn't seem to be a clear way to indicate to go back to the drawing board and come up with a better finalist list. Nevertheless, this topic is on the agenda for the Commander's meeting where it is hoped that pressure can be put forth to have these three Brand Names ignored and another more appropriate list developed.

At the September 13th, Rideau District Council meeting, all the Squadron Commanders in the District voted unanimously that the three finalists selected did not meet the objectives of a Brand Name.



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The following is taken from an email by Jeff Evans, Chair, Special Projects Committee (they came up with the three finalists) and will provide you more background information on this topic;

"On Saturday June 9th, the Special Projects Committee announced to Governing Board the three finalists in the Brand Name Contest. One of the three was defined by OpCom in April to permit for at least one traditional designation to go forth. The other two finalists came from the contest entries. Just shy of 200 entries were made to the contest from throughout the country.

The three finalists are:

- 1. CPS-ECP
- 2. Nautique Canada
- 3. CPS Nautique

Background:

#### **CPS-ECP**

- a traditional "brand name" for our organization
- recognizes both official languages
- brand recognition for those that know our organization
- allows for the least change in the "flat flag" logo and brand, migrating from: CPS•ECP to CPS-ECP
- refers to both "Canadian Power & Sail Squadrons" (indirectly) and "Les escadrilles canadiennes de plaisance"

#### **NAUTIQUE CANADA**

- a new "brand name" for of our organization
- · recognizes both official languages
- gives a nautical reference to our activities in "Nautique"
- the organization is clearly Canadian
- only similar organization name is Water Ski and Wakeboard Canada (Ski Nautique et planche Canada) who used to be known as "Ski Nautique Canada" http://www.waterski.ca

#### **CPS NAUTIQUE**

- an evolved "brand name" for our organization
- · recognizes both official languages
- brand recognition for those that know our organization
- represents our original (1938) name "Canadian Power Squadron"
- gives a nautical reference to our activities in



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# Membership Update

his is my first article for the Ripples as the new Membership Officer. I am really not sure what you are looking for so please bear with me because there will be a lot of firsts in this article! I plan to produce an article for each edition of the "Ripples" from now on!

In June 2007, the CPS Governing Board moved THAT

a "REGULAR" one-year CPS Membership be awarded to each student who takes the CPS Boating Course and achieves the required passing mark. Further, that an "ASSOCIATE" one-year CPS Membership be awarded to each student who takes the CPS BOAT PRO Course and achieves the required passing mark. After one year they will receive the membership renewal notice by e-mail or Canada Post like all members. The rationale of National for this proactive membership strategy is to give all Membership Officers supported by their Bridge a year to try and retain the Member, interest them in other courses, member benefits and volunteer opportunities. How about keeping the ones who are already members?

Having said that, your Squadron has 607 members of which 460 are current and 147 are either outstanding or expired. You want to know your status? Simply send me an e-mail message and I will advise you of your membership status.

At the time of drafting this article, our percentage of Outstanding or Expired Memberships stands at approx. 32%. With YOUR help, we would reduce this percentage at least by 25% by Christmas and another 25% by the end of March. The first step in my reduction program is up to YOU to send me an email message and let's talk. The second will be an e-mail message or a letter from me asking YOU to renew or rejoin. Unfortunately, the last step of this program will be to remove YOU from the membership list in April 2008 if YOUR Membership is still Outstanding or Expired! More later in upcoming Ripples on YOUR removal from the membership list and the loss of benefits YOU would enjoy as a Member if you do not renew or rejoin.

Recently National rolled out the "Web Based Administration System" to allow squadron officers to directly input changes, membership, transfer, etc. I have been dabbling with it for the last couple of weeks and it is an operator friendly system. Our Squadron will still be required to maintain its own database in order to capture the information required for the annual roster, mailing, etc. This system will also allow YOU to update your own information in the National Database. This is a new toy so time will tell how it will assist us! At the Conference & AGM, I plan on attending one of the Web-based Admin System Seminars to get more familiar with the system. I will expand on this new system in upcoming Ripples.


