Earth-friendly boat maintenance

ere are again some tips which can help ease the environmental impact of routine boat maintenance:

Keep a supply of oil-absorbant rags on board for spill cleanup of oil and fuel. Even small spills of oil can contaminate a large volume of water.

Properly dispose of used oil and filters - facilities are available to handle these elements which are toxic to the marine environment. In Canada call 1 800-667-4321 for the nearest disposal facility.

Keep used solvents separate from used oil - never mix wastes, or pour hazardous wastes down drains, on the ground or into surface waters.

Wax your boat - A good coat of wax on a fiberglass hull prevents surface dirt from becoming engrained. This will reduce the need for detergents when you wash your boat. Pollen, dust, spores, or salt occur naturally and will do no harm when they are washed into the water.



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Wash topsides only - Limit dock side hull cleaning to the above water surface area only -- from the boot stripe up. Use a sponge to effectively remove light growth without creating the clouds of heavy metals usually caused by scrubbing. Rinse your boat with fresh water.

CPS MERIT MARKS

National Volunteer Week was April 18-24, 2010 and the Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons recognized our volunteers by issuing Merit Mark Certificates to the many members who give selflessly volunteering by; instructing courses, Watch Keeper at the Ottawa Boat & Sportsmen's Show, helping at a Squadron Function or being Bridge Officers, etc.

Course Price: \$60.00 for adults and \$50.00 for students. Payment may be made in Cash, Cheque, Visa or MasterCard. Please make cheques payable to "**Ottawa Power and Sail Squadron**". / PCOC Exam Challengers \$30.00

This Canadian Coast Guard accredited course is designed for you and your family to obtain a Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC), the proof of competency required under government regulation. It is also recognized by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (USA). This operator card is valid for life.

Boat Pro is a highly acclaimed safety related course held in three sessions, over consecutive weeks. Boat Pro is suitable for fishermen, cottagers, and Personal Watercraft boaters. This course provides an excellent introduction to water safety for all members of the family. We encourage youth from age twelve and over to participate and obtain their PCOC. Everyone who operates a pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes must have a PCOC after September 15, 2009.

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Disposal of Flares

Disposal of flares is an ongoing issue for boaters. As boaters, we need to replace our flares every four years from the date of manufacture, which is stamped on every flare.



Before we know it we have accumulated way more flares than we can ever hope to use in an emergency, so the issue of flare disposal comes to light.

Thanks to John Basler with the Cornwall Squadron, we have been directed to Roger Lalonde who disposes of flares voluntarily. Roger is one of only two [2] volunteers in Canada that have the pyrotechnic license to 'dispose' of flares. Roger is our local contact and is a CPS Life Member from the Cornwall Squadron.

Roger will dispose of your expired outdated flares, Emergency Position Indicator Radio Beacons (EPIRB), personal and commercial emergency locators (ELT), Manoverboard smoke and light signals (pleasure crafts and commercial) by disarming and recycling the parts and disposing in an environmentally friendly way.

There is no fee for this disposal service however you will need to physically get your flares to Roger. This service is <u>open to all boaters</u> whether you are a CPS member or not. Remember - flares are considered a "dangerous good" so mailing or shipping them is not possible.

May we suggest that you co-ordinate your disposal efforts through your Squadron in hopes that a "milk run" can be arranged where different Squadrons collect the flares and then finish off in Cornwall.
