Commander's Comments

The Annual Picnic of the Ottawa Squadron took place on June 17th, 2010 at the Long Island Lock Station. We were blessed with a beautiful evening (no rain for the first time in years) and a good time was had by all of those who attended. Particular thanks goes to our Executive Officer, Guy Ladouceur, who took on the prime responsibility for the organization of the picnic, Marjorie Ladouceur (the power behind Guy) and Dr. Bob Morgan who stepped in to act as the picnic auctioneer.

My wife, Chris, and I spent a wonderful two weeks on our boat travelling from Len's Cove Marina on the Big Rideau Lake down the Rideau system to Kingston and then into the Thousand Island area. As usual, the lock staff on the Rideau system was friendly and helpful. For those of you who have not travelled on the Rideau system, it is a trip to seriously consider. Picturesque lock stations, beautiful lakes and lovely scenery make a trip through the Rideau system a trip to remember. Even those boaters who have not had any experience in bringing their boats through the locks will not have any difficulties in enjoying the trip, as the lockmasters and their assistants are knowledgeable, helpful and very friendly.



We stayed at the Confederation Basin Marina in Kingston for two days, enjoying the shops and restaurants in the downtown area of the Kingston. The wind felt like it was at hurricane force when we arrived at the marina, but the knowledgeable and agile young dock staff make sure that the boats coming into the marina get safely tucked into the appropriate slips.

The Thousand Island area of which Kingston is the western gate is a magnificent boating area and readily available to those of us belonging to the Ottawa Squadron. The marked channels are easy to follow, but there are many areas outside of the channel markers where boats can enjoy safe passage and wonderful anchorages. It helps to travel with friends who have local knowledge of the area and who can lead you into and point out the lovely "out of channel areas".

Travelling on the boat reinforced our view that the majority of boaters are friendly, approachable and willing to provide assistance when needed. However, a day on one of the park island docks close to a boater who felt that anyone within 100 yards of his boat not only liked the same music as he did, but wanted the music played at ear-splitting levels reminded those of us travelling together that good boaters give some consideration to those around them. Silence is bliss – every once in awhile.

The Squadron courses begin again in September of 2010. The course outline is set out in this issue of the Ripples. Take a course and/or recommend that your friends or family do so. Increased knowledge makes us all better boaters.

BOATPRO COURSE DESCRIPTION: 3 two-hour weekly sessions.

This Canadian Coast Guard accredited course is designed for you and your family to obtain a Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC), the proof of competency required under government regulation. It is also recognized by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (USA). This operator card is valid for life.

 Boat Pro is a highly acclaimed safety related course held in three sessions, over consecutive weeks. Boat Pro is suitable for fishermen, cottagers, and Personal Watercraft boaters. This course provides an excellent introduction to water safety for all members of the family. We encourage youth from age twelve and over to participate and obtain their PCOC. Everyone who operates a pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes must have a PCOC after September 15, 2009.
