The Impact of Grey Water

Grey Water Is defined as waste water from bathing, laundry and other cleaning such as washing dishes. Grey water frequently contains caustic chemicals such as soaps, detergents and bleaches that can harm the marine environment. Some gray water may also contain bacterial contamination.

Biological Oxygen Demand: When gray water (or black water), enters rivers and lakes it carries suspended organic substances which must be broken down by bacteria. These bacteria need oxygen to do their work. BOD, or biochemical oxygen demand, describes how much additional demand for oxygen is required by the contaminant that has entered the water. The higher the BOD for breaking down contaminants, the less available oxygen there is for normal aquatic plants and animals.

Steps You Can Take: Even in the absence of good options for grey water management, you can take a number of steps to mitigate the effect of any grey water discharged from your boat on the marine environment:

- Shore side: Use shore side facilities whenever you are at a dock (restrooms, showers, laundry)
- **Detergents**: Make sure onboard detergents are the most environmental friendly products you can buy. Look for the three-doves logo
- **Skip the shower**. A swim is more refreshing, requires no soap and is a good way to exercise.
- Washing (face, teeth, shave, shampoo). Face and hands with water and minimal soap. Rinse and rub dry. Shave – use electric or use a paper towel to gather soap. Hair – Use baby shampoo, it is phosphate free and phbalanced.
- **Dirty dishes are tough**. Never let them dry dirty. Scrape food waste in garbage and use paper towels. Then soak as soon as possible. If barbequing or frying, consider using a paper plate over a regular plate.

• **Containment**: If possible, contain your grey water and dispose of it at a proper pump-out station.

Can you please remind me how to receive a quotation from Cowan Insurance?

The best and quickest way to get a quotation is through our website:

- > Go to www.cowangroup.ca
- Under the heading "Get a Quote", click on the arrow of the drop-down box and choose "Boat Insurance"
- Click on the box that says "Get a Boat Insurance Quote"
- Fill in the blanks. (Note: no need for serial #s for quotes)

Your information will go directly to the person who handles the quotes. Our standard turnaround time is 24 hours; however, we usually get them back to you same day.

If you prefer, we can also fax or email you a copy of the application. Just call our office at 1-800-268-2628.

Once you receive your quote and it is acceptable, you can provide us with the hull serial # and effective date. We will then issue the policy.

Please note that you must renew your CPS membership every year to qualify for the CPS discounts.

Winter will be arriving soon enough! Does my policy cover ice or freezing?

Dear CPS Member:

We will not cover loss to the engine or machinery caused directly or indirectly by ice or freezing unless winterization has been carried out by a licensed mechanic or licensed shiprepairer. However, loss to any other property other than the engine or machinery caused by dampness or temperature change is excluded under the policy.

This Canadian Coast Guard accredited course is designed for you and your family to obtain a Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC), the proof of competency required under government regulation. It is also recognized by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (USA). This operator card is valid for life.

Boat Pro is a highly acclaimed safety related course held in three sessions, over consecutive weeks. Boat Pro is suitable for fishermen, cottagers, and Personal Watercraft boaters. This course provides an excellent introduction to water safety for all members of the family. We encourage youth from age twelve and over to participate and obtain their PCOC. Everyone who operates a pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes must have a PCOC after September 15, 2009.
